The MiniMax is doing well towards completion. Wings getting painted and hope to shoot color within a week. The fuselage and engine are in good shape to mount wings when done. Some workers are being transferred off the MiniMax and on to the Air Camper and the BD-6 as they start getting more attention. Spars are on order for the Piet to save time and 1st aluminum parts have been cut for the BD-6. Both should start ramping up shortly.







Old Business:

John Weber reports that one of our Youth Program members has submitted paperwork seeking a Ray Scholarship from AOPA. Over 200 Chapters have now submitted applications to EAA for the Ray Foundation Scholarship and we hope to submit three candidates once we find out if our Chapter meets EAA's qualifying criteria.

The CAP Lake Composite Squadron SER-FL-021 visited the EAA Hanger at Leesburg Airport on Thursday 2/21/19 to learn what we do there. About 18 Squadron members marched over from their meeting to spend 45 minutes with some Chapter volunteers talking about aviation, the EAA, and the industry. As with lots of our visitors, we try to introduce them to the wide range of interests and jobs present in aerospace. If you are a Young Eagle pilot, please contact Marc Morel (if you haven't) to give him some info needed to speed up our YE fly day paperwork. After much discussion, and via MM&S, the Chapter agreed by voice vote to try to sell the TM-5. It was agreed it would be better off converted to cash to be used elsewhere vs trying to put it in flyable condition ourselves. It would take too long and drain resources we don't have. A base sale price was established 'as is' at \$2000; or a 'best offer' which would need Board approval if lower.


There being no further business to come before the Membership, the President adjourned the meeting at 11:10 am.




Don't do as I did in 1978 in our club Cessna 150^{*}! I purchased Duane Cole's "Turn around a Point", read the section on Spins every night and memorized every move.

Next time I took out the 150 on a beautiful sunny day, I put the opened book on the passenger seat and at 5000 feet over Lake Champlain, I attempted spins!

After a few feeble attempts I succeeded to spin and recover after 1.5 turns and to scare the bejesus out myself. I flew home, humbled.


I met up with Duane at Oshkosh in 1995 and proudly told him my story. He sternly scolded me, he said: *"Never do that again! Get*
